

## **ADDENDUM A**

### **ECONOMIC REVITALIZATION**

1. Organize Jewish venture capital funds to support and encourage growth downtown. Federation supporting foundations and philanthropic funds can provide venture capital for the development of Jewish owned businesses downtown.
2. Maintain a significant downtown staff in order to contribute to the city's economic base.
3. Play a role for job connections and job opportunities for young Jewish professionals.
4. Coordinate with all agencies to market Cleveland and attract Jews to Cleveland.

### **COMMUNITY RELATIONS/TIKKUN OLAM**

1. Provide multi-use space that would cater to Jewish agencies and the broader community based on the model of Trinity Commons or 92<sup>nd</sup> Street Y. Such space could include a fitness center, day care, library, space for classes, and a room for various Jewish organizations. All programming is intended to bring more Jews downtown.
2. Create an inviting, attractive, green facility, with open space and free parking.
3. Create "Birthright Cleveland" set up along the lines of Birthright Israel.

4. Establish a new charter school sponsored by JCF in or near the current JCF building. Engage volunteers; engage young Jews to teach (like Teach for America). Such a program could generate revenue for JCF (rent).

### **ENGAGE THE NEXT GENERATION**

1. Create internships for Jews in downtown Cleveland.
2. Match young people to jobs in a centralized job referral system. Hold job fairs at Federation.
3. Create networking circles (social, professional) for next generation and link them to other ethnic group's professional associations.
4. Establish scholarship programs for local universities. After graduation, the student must remain in Cleveland for 2+ years.
